

1. Palace of the Parliament

Address: 2-4 Izvor Street, București

The Palace of the Parliament is the seat of the Parliament of Romania. Located on Dealul Arsenalului in the national capital city of central Bucharest, it is the second largest administrative building in the world after the United States' Pentagon near Washington, DC.

2. Romanian Athenaeum

Address: 1-3 Benjamin Franklin Street, București 030167

The Romanian Athenaeum is a concert hall in the center of Bucharest, Romania and a landmark of the Romanian capital city. Opened in 1888, the ornate, domed, circular building is the city's main concert hall and home of the "George Enescu" Philharmonic and of the George Enescu annual international music festival.

3. The National Museum of Art of Romania

Address: 49-53Calea Victoriei, București 010063

The National Museum of Art of Romania is the country's prime holder of Romanian, European and Oriental art. Located in the former Royal Palace in Bucharest, it includes the National Gallery (Romanian medieval and modern art) and the European Art Gallery. Apart from numerous temporary exhibitions, visitors can also join guided tours of the former Throne Hall and other spaces of historical relevance.

4. Romanian Peasant Museum

Address: 3 Pavel Dimitrievici Kiseleff Street, București 011341

The National Museum of the Romanian Peasant is a museum in Bucharest, Romania, with a collection of textiles, icons, ceramics, and other artifacts of Romanian peasant life. One of Europe's leading museums of popular arts and traditions.

5. "Dimitrie Gusti" National Village Museum

Address: 28-30, Pavel Dimitrievici Kiseleff Street, București 011347

The Village Museum is an open-air ethnographic museum located in the King Michael I Park, showcasing traditional Romanian village life. The museum extends to over 100,000 m², and contains 272 authentic peasant farms and houses from all over Romania.

6. The Theodor Aman Museum

Address: 8 CA Rosetti Street

The Theodor Aman Museum is one of the most beautiful private residences in Bucharest, built in 1868 following Theodor Aman's own designs. It is also one of the few buildings that has remained unchanged during its existence, and is the first workshop-residence in Romania.

7. The National Museum of Romanian History

Address: 12 Calea Victoriei, București 030026

The National Museum of Romanian History is a museum located on Calea Victoriei in Bucharest, Romania, which contains Romanian historical artifacts from prehistoric times up to modern times. The museum is located inside the former Postal Services Palace, which also houses a philatelic museum.

8. George Enescu National Museum

Address: 141 Calea Victoriei, București 010071

Palace-turned-museum featuring exhibits on the life of the famous Romanian musician George Enescu.
